## Hospice Welcomes and Honors Board Members at Recent Annual Meeting

At the 2009 Annual Meeting of Hospice of Randolph County on Tuesday, April 14, attendees were presented with organizational achievements from the previous year. The meeting, called to order by Board Chair, Attorney Bob Mason, and Hospice CEO/President, Rhonda Burch, M.A., M.B.A., was held to update the public on the previous year's accomplishments and present the vision and goals for the future. Reports were given from each department within the agency on goals that were met throughout the year. The headlining accomplishment from 2008 was meeting and exceeding the \$1.55 million hospice home capital campaign goal. An update was given in regard to the construction time-frame for the home. Officials plan to break ground on the facility in late summer. Hospice of Randolph County officials also reported that the organization continued to experience an increase in patient care census and community service offerings. In relation, the agency reported that it had made a major transition to digital patient recordkeeping. Clinical staff was trained in 2008 to utilize laptops for documentation and case management. Also, three individuals were honored at the luncheon for their many years of leadership and service as members of the Hospice of Randolph County Board of Directors. The individuals retiring after serving a six-year term on the board were:

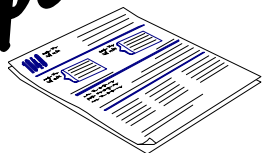

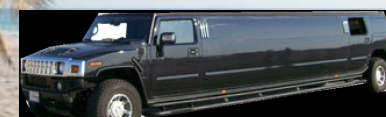
